# Off-Center Mint Error Sales

Off-Center Market<br>Lincoln Wheatback Cent

Collectors are aware that most of these dates are nearly impossible to find. They are willing to substitute off centers with broadstrikes or partial collars. It is not unusual to find these error types mixed within a collection. The collector will purchase these dated error types that fill the void in their collection. Some dates take decades before one shows up for sale.

Scan through the back issues of Mint Error News to look up prices realized for the early Lincolns. The closer to the $50 \%$ off center with a full date and mintmark, the more money is paid. The color of the coin is a major price factor. Almost each quarter 1956-D and 1957-D are sold on eBay. A few sold! The ones that were offered in high grades failed to sell due to prices
asked. The major auction houses have been selling these in high grades for way more than what eBayers are willing to pay.

Since the grading services started listing problem coins as "Genuine", there has been an influx of these being offered on eBay. This site has become a dumping ground for inferior coins. Lots of scratched, cleaned and questionable items are showing up regularly. When the seller states "you grade", it might be a good time to stay away from the item. Check out the "solds" to see how many were cleaned or damaged.

I have noticed that quite a few of the previously sold off centers are being reoffered on eBay after they are marketed through a major auction house. A further observation is eBay is not bringing the big dollars that the auction houses are. I believe most eBayers are frustrated with
inferior material being purchased from eBay.

Reader of my charts must understand that some of the listings on eBay may have been overlooked. This is a guide only. What if the previous reported sale price sold because the seller listed it as a "Buy it now?" Or, the lot was misdescribed? There are numerous factors to consider when reading charts. One major thing to consider is my charts show coins sold exclusively on eBay.

The date collector knows the true market for error types. They do not follow coins sold on eBay exclusively. They frequent shows. Subscribe to most auction catalogs. Solicit error dealers with their want lists. Many times these collectors accept coins in which the percentage of off center is minor since this is all that is available.

Here are records of recent sales of off-center mint errors on eBay from October 1, 2010 to December 31, 2010.

1. All lots had buyers. If the coins actually changed hands is unknown.
2. A picture accompanied each lot or it was not recognized.
3. Mislabeled items were ignored.
4. Some lots may have changed hands more than once.
5. "D" next to the date symbolizes that the coin had damage or was scratched.
6. "C" next to the date symbolizes that the coin was cleaned.
7. "B" next to the date symbolizes that the coin had damage and was cleaned.
8. If the date or mint mark was missing or partially visible, parentheses were used.
9. Postage/handling/insurance fees were ignored.
10. Major auctions were not listed.

# Double Denomination \& Off-Metal Mint Error Sales 

## by Al Levy (alscoins.com)

One of the most popular error types are double denominations. The high end "common dates" graded over MS65 have stabilized in price. However, the sellers are still not willing to reduce their ask price. Collectors need to realized that for some dates and mintmarks only a handful are known to exist. Eye appeal will generate a higher price paid than a grade.

When a new seller lists this error type and does not uti-
lize quality pictures or descriptions, they sell for a fraction of their real value. Refer to the notes attached to the sold item. Prices have not dropped. It means the buyer may be able to turn a quick profit by reselling it. Keep in mind that eBay sales are a small fraction of the true error coin market. Dates, mintmarks and grading services all make a difference in value. Read over my notes to help you decipher the real market.

Here are records of recent sales of off-center mint errors on eBay from October 1, 2010 to December 31, 2010.

## Double Denomination \& Off-Metal Error Sales

There are date collectors for off metals. Completing this may not be possible. For the collector that has been looking for specific dates to come on the market may have been waiting for decades. So, it is not unusual to see an MS64 example sell for the same price as an AU55. If you do not stretch for this coin, it may not show up on the market for another decade.

Off metals have a very high eye appeal. Cents struck on dime
planchets have always peaked collectors interests. Same with nickels or quarters struck on cent planchets. Check out the price variance between an example that sells that has a brown color to one that is a full red. The red coin may bring twice the price due to EYE APPEAL!

Multiple errors on off metals are highly desirable. There may only be one example of an off metal struck off center. Or, double struck plus off metal.

Common are the $25 \mathrm{c} 1970-\mathrm{D}$ on 10c stock planchet. Try and find examples for other years or on other denominations. These are very under rated and under valued error types. Some collectors hope to determine that these errors are actually struck on a foreign blank.

Check out the price differences for the 1970-D 10c struck on dime stock. The better the picture, the higher the bid. When the seller lists the coin
and states: "You Grade It", chances are the coin was cleaned or scratched. (Some of the grades listed below are a guess on my behalf.)

The problem with eBay, there are many coins being sold as off metals, off stock. See my chart below "Counterfeits/Questionable errors". eBay has become a real "Dump and Run" auction site.

The buyers must ask questions prior to bidding. Such as: What is the weight? Is the color natural? What is your return policy?

# Rotated Reverse 

## by AlLevy (ascoins.com)

Most rotated reverse errors listed on eBay the seller fails to mention the percentage of rotation. Other times, no mention if they are clockwise (CW) or counterclockwise (CCW). The grading services omit the same information on their labels. Many of these sold have been ignored as I do not have the time trying to figure out what actually sold. Grading
services may only list that the coin has die rotation with no degrees notated. Medallic rotation means the reverse is rotated 180 degrees. The most desirable rotated coins are the Morgan and Peace dollar series. These bring very strong prices. Two cent pieces are the opposite, as they are very common in degree of rotation and are easily found.

Missing edge lettering: The George Washington dollars have dropped in value since my last report. John Adams dollars remain unchanged.

The double edge lettering John Adams dollars are changing hands at lower prices. PCGS and NGC prices dropped slightly. Raw examples dropped in value. A few Satin Finish examples have shown up on eBay that are MEL. Only a few of these are known with the collector choosing to ignore them or pay a very low price.

Various other Presidential smooth edge dollars that are Unc and (SMS) satin finish are being offered. These Satin Finish examples are found in Special Mint Sets that are suppose to be scrutinized
by the mint employees at each process.
In 2009, the Sacagawea dollars started have edge lettering. For 2009 and 2010, some examples of MEL's are showing up.

Partial edge lettering and weak edge lettering errors have all gone down in price. This includes the ones found in (SMS) special mint sets.

Some rare examples of missing edge lettering (MEL) are selling cheap. One reason, they are not real examples of the error. Buyer beware!!!

# PCGS Certifies 1905 Indian Cent Struck on A \$1/2 Giold Planchet

## From The Heritage Auction Listing:

Exactly five Indian cents are known on gold planchets, according to information available to us. Among them are three dated 1900, this piece dated 1905, and an example dated 1906. The Judd pattern reference lists 1900 and 1907 gold cents in the section on mint errors. However, Andrew W. Pollock, III, listed the 1900 gold Indian cents as P-1990 in the regular pattern section of his reference. Pollock writes: "Listed in Judd as a mint error, but it is difficult to imagine that a Mint employee would be so careless as to feed gold planchets into a coinage press fitted with one-cent piece dies." Pollock suggests that these pieces may have been deliberately struck for one or more collectors.

The following Census of gold Indian cents and additional information about them is compiled from a variety of sources, including www.uspatterns.com http://www. uspatterns.com , www.minterrornews.com http://www. minterrornews.com , Donald Taxay's 1976 Catalogue and Encyclopedia, Andrew Pollock's 1994 United States Patterns and Related Issues, the Judd reference, and selected auction catalogs. Conversations with Fred Weinberg and Richard Snow provided additional background.

1900 MS65 PCGS. Col. E.H.R. Green; B.G. Johnson; John Beck (Abner Kreisberg Corporation, 1/1975), lot 609; Mike Byers; Auction '89 (Superior, 7/1989), lot 856; Bowers and Merena (8/1991), lot 4103; recently PCGS authenticated as a 1900 Indian cent struck on a gold $\$ 2.50$ planchet, and graded MS65. The 1991 ANA catalog gives a weight of 65.8 grains, 1.3 grains too much for a quarter eagle planchet.

1900 AU55. Heritage (8/1993), lot 8000. The 1993 ANA catalog gives a weight of 4.35 grams ( 67.12 grains), 2.62 grains too much for a quarter eagle planchet.

1900. Michael Hodder reported in a May 14, 1996 letter to Q. David Bowers that he had personally seen three different pieces, all with weights in the range of 65.8 to 67.1 grains. See Bowers' A Buyer's and Enthusiast's Guide to Flying Eagle and Indian Cents, p. 427.

1905 MS64 PCGS. Apparently unknown to the numismatic community prior to the current offering. Weight: 64.5 grains, the standard weight for a quarter eagle planchet.

1906 AU58 NGC. Stack's (6/2004), lot 4097; Stack's (9/2009), lot 4299. Weight: 64.4 grains, within the 0.25 grain tolerance for a quarter eagle planchet.

## PCGS Certifies 1905 Indian Cent Struck On A \$212 Gold Planchet

1907. Listed in the Judd pattern book, and in Donald Taxay's Catalogue and Encyclopedia [of] U.S. Coins. The 1907 gold Indian cent is currently unlocated.

One example dated 1900 is also known in silver, from the identical dies as the 1900 gold Indian cents, suggesting they were all made at or near the same time. Rick Snow writes in A Guide Book of Flying Eagle and Indian Head Cents that "both the silver and gold examples are
struck from the same dies, with light roughness on the reverse die, probably from die rust." That all three 1900 pieces have higher weights suggests that they were specially made, perhaps without the knowledge of Mint officials. Fred Weinberg explained to this cataloger that "the weights vary because in all probability, they were on planchets that might not have been filed down to the proper weight spread." Hand adjusting of individual gold planchets continued in the Mint until circa 1910.


## PCGS Certifies 1905 Indian Cent Struck On A \$212 Gold Planchet

Those three pieces are almost certainly fancy pieces made for collectors, while the 1905 and 1906 examples, on correct weight planchets, are more likely pieces truly made in error, and substantially more important as such. This example is slightly off-center toward 9 o'clock, the tops of UNITED STATES off the planchet. The strike is weak at the date, feather tips, RICA, the outer parts of the wreath, and the ribbon bow. The weakness seems counter to expectations of the soft gold, but the diameter
is at least a full millimeter less than an Indian cent, meaning that the metal flowed out and was insufficient to accept the design from the deepest recesses of the dies. Both sides have fully brilliant yellow surfaces with frosty mint luster. A few faint hairlines on the cheek prevent a Gem grade assignment. This stunning gold Indian cent is one of the truly amazing error coins we have ever handled.

Here is the information regarding the 5 pc . Proof Gold Pattern Isle of Man Cat Coins.

Of the five (5) Gem Proof 1 oz . Pattern Gold coins, only one was approved as a final production piece for the SILVER and COPPER/NICKEL Cat series. Derek Pobjoy said that he had to produce five (5) designs to be presented to the "Lord of the Exchequer", who would in turn show them to the Queen, and she would then approve one of the designs. The final design for the Silver \& Copper/Nickel issues mentioned above is included in the group of five (5) pieces.

Please note that these all say " 1 Crown". The words "Fine 1 oz . Gold" is not on these Patterns. That makes all of them in Gold, including the adopted design, quite different from the normal Proof Gold issues of 1988. The first Cat coin was issued in 1988 showing the Manx cat. All subsequent issues show a "privy" mark on the Manx cat in the background fields. I was pleasantly surprised with the Gem quality of these most unusual patterns, struck twenty years ago.

I hope the above information will be useful, and should be kept with the set of coins.

# NGG Certifies Newly Discovered 

## Platinum Eagle Variety

A 2007 W platinum $\$ 100$ piece in proof with an obvious die-polishing error has been found.

The latest oddity to surface in the U . S. Mint's American Eagle Bullion Coin series is a $2007-\mathrm{W}$ platinum $\$ 100$ piece in proof with an obvious die-polishing error. This popular coin type, which features a facing eagle with wings outstretched, also includes a shield on the eagle's breast. Draped over this shield is a banner inscribed with the W mintmark at left and the word FREEDOM at right. On dies having a normal polishing pattern, this incuse word displays the same brilliant finish as the coin's fields, thus standing out within the frosted banner. The newly-discovered variety has the word frosted so that it blends in with the rest of the design. Presently unique, this curious coin has been certified by NGC as PF-70 Ultra Cameo, and it's also identified on the label as FROSTED FREEDOM and DISCOVERY SPECIMEN.

The 2011 edition of R. S. Yeoman's A Guide Book of United States Coins illustrates this coin type with a U . S. Mint-generated rendering that indeed shows the word FREEDOM frosted, as on this error coin, but
that illustration is believed to be a conceptual drawing that predated actual production. With evermore of the Mint's die preparation becoming automated, it's likely that this die simply missed the step which normally would have polished the incuse lettering to a mirror finish. Though the present coin is the first example found with a uniformly frosted finish to the banner, it's likely that others must have been struck, and collectors are urged to examine their 2007-W proof platinum $\$ 100$ coins for additional specimens.

## Frosting Error Surfaces

The word FREEDOM is frosted instead of brilliantly polished.

Last month's newsletter included an announcement that NGC had certified a proof platinum American Eagle $\$ 100$ one-ounce piece coined from dies on which the word FREEDOM had been erroneously frosted. The coin was discovered by Jason Fishman, who submitted
it to NGC, and we urged readers to examine their own coins for additional examples. Before any such reports came into us, another denomination of this coin series turned up here for grading and confirmation of the frosting error. Like the other example, this one is a 2007-W proof platinum piece, but it is the quarter-ounce $\$ 25$ issue. The incuse letters in FREEDOM appear
on the banner draping the shield on the reverse of this coin type, and the letters are supposed to be brilliantly polished, appearing in silhouette against the frosted banner. In this new discovery there is absolutely no trace of brilliant surface within the letters, and they clearly were given the same frosted finish as the rest of the eagle motif.

## Broadstrikes



Abroadstruck error occurs when a coin is struck without the collar to form the rim and edge that is part of the shape of the coin. Coins can be broadstruck on either type one or type two planchets. When a coin is broadstruck the blank being fed into the collar will spread and distort outward as it is being struck because the collar isn't in the correct position to retain it.

# Mint Error News Price Guide 

## Partial Collars



Partial collar strikes occur when there is a malfunction of the striking press. This causes the collar to be in an incorrect position. The lower die (usually the reverse die) is recessed in the collar. This allows the coin which is going to be struck to have a formed rim. After a coin is struck the lower die raises upwards, pushing the struck coin out of the collar and ejecting it. If a blank entering the collar is not properly seated, it will only have partial reeding as it is struck. The edge of this coin will have a partial reeding and a partial blank surface area. Recently, the Mint has installed new machinery where either die can be installed in either position.

## Uniface Strikes



Uniface coins occur when there have been two blank planchets in the press at the same time. The other blank will obstruct the die on either the obverse or reverse side, which will prevent it from having that design on the coin. There are many different variations involving uniface errors. In addition to having a $100 \%$ blank obverse or reverse, a coin can be struck off-center, with a blank planchet in the collar which will obstruct one side of the off-center. There are also mated pairs which have a combination of multiple errors which can include a side which is uniface. Finally, there are uniface strikes due to a die cap which adhered to the die, forming itself in the shape of a die and striking blank planchets.

## Bonded Coins



Bonded coins occur when the feeder system, which supplies blank planchets to the coin press, malfunctions and jams. When this occurs, a struck coin is not properly ejected and another planchet is fed into the collar and is struck. This struck coin will land on top of the previously unejected strike. These coins will then crush and bond together. This may occur many times as more coins bond.

## Coins Struck on Feeder Finger Tips



After a recent tour of the U.S. Mint in Philadelphia, it was discovered that the minting process had changed to some degree. One of the changes was that "feeder fingers" were used during the striking of all denominations of U.S. coins. Prior to this tour, U.S. coins that were struck on feeder finger tips were authenticated and described as being struck on aluminum scrap. Coins from all modern denominations have been discovered that were struck on the tips of these feeder fingers.

## Struck Fragments



TThe blanking press takes the coils of metal strips and punches blanks out of it, ejecting the webbing at the other end. The webbing is cut into small scrap pieces to be melted and recycled. Occasionally a scrap piece will be mixed with the blank planchets and struck by the dies. Struck fragments are rare in the larger denominations. These can be uniface or die struck both sides and are very rare on type coins.

## Mated Pairs



Mated pairs involve two individual coins with different errors that were struck together at the same time. Mated pair error combinations can be found in most error types and come in many shapes and sizes. Mated pairs can be overlapped when one of the coins is struck off-center on top of another coin. Another type involves a brockage where a struck coin was perfectly centered on a blank and restruck. Some mated pairs involve a die cap where the cap and brockage coin are discovered together, but this is a scarce find.

The rarest mated pair type involves two die caps (obverse and reverse) where both dies were capped at the same time and both die caps are mated. This last type is extremely rare and there are only a few known examples of mated pairs involving an obverse die cap and reverse die cap. There are several of these mated pairs known on Kennedy Halves including two dated 1976, which is the Bicentennial year. One of the most spectacular mated pairs involve two Barber Dimes, an obverse die cap mated to a reverse die cap and are unique.

Mated pairs can also involve an off-metal where a smaller blank planchet or smaller struck coin was struck on top of a larger coin. This type is extremely rare. The most spectacular pair known is a double struck Franklin Half which was mated to a Lincoln Cent. The Lincoln Cent blank was on top of the obverse of the struck Franklin Half. This pair was then struck together. It is unique.

## Transitional Errors



Atransitional error occurs when a coin is struck on a planchet from a previous year with different metal composition. The most famous transitional is a 1943 copper cent struck on a 1942 copper blank. 1943 cents were struck in steel because of the copper shortage during World War II. Other famous transitionals include 1965 coinage struck in silver instead of clad.

There are also transitionals struck on blanks for the next year. An example is 1964 coinage in clad instead of silver. Most recently, transitionals were discovered involving the SBA and Sacagawea Dollars of 1999 and 2000. There are eight known 1999 SBA Dollars struck on the brass planchet for the 2000 Sacagawea Dollar, and four known 2000 Sacagawea Dollars struck on a clad planchet for the 1999 SBA Dollar.

## U.S. Gold Errors



Major mint errors on U.S. Gold coins are the most prized category of all mint errors. Gold errors are very rare and a few have traded in the $\$ 75,000$ to $\$ 100,000$ range. Even a broadstruck U.S. Gold coin can easily sell for $\$ 15,000$ to $\$ 30,000$ compared to a broadstruck Cent, Nickel, Dime or Quarter which all sell for well under $\$ 10$. Many serious collectors of Gold Errors have to wait patiently for months and sometimes even years to aquire that one special piece for their collection.

The prices listed here are for common dates in AU-Unc. Better dates and errors that are in gem condition are worth considerably more.

## Indents



An indent error occurs when two blanks are fed inadvertently into the same collar, with one blank partly overlaying on top of the other. When the hammer die strikes this combination, the upper blank will be forced into the lower blank, creating a depression which is shaped similar to the upper blank. A scarce type of indent occurs when a blank intended for one denomination lands on top of a blank from a different denomination.

## Die Adjustment Strikes



Die adjustment strikes are also known as die trials. This error occurs when a coin is struck from the press with very little pressure. When the press is being set up and adjusted, extremely weak strikes occur as the strike pressure reaches its optimum level. These die trials are destroyed after being struck and are rarely found in circulation.

## Double Denominations



One of the most expensive, popular, and desired types of errors are the double denominations. This error happens when a coin is struck on a previously struck coin of a smaller denomination. Examples are a cent on a struck dime, and a nickel on a struck cent. The most dramatic are those with considerable design visible from the original strike. There are a few known double denominations with different dates.

## Brockages



Abrockage error can only occur when there are two coins involved. One of the coins involved will always be a struck coin which has not ejected properly. That struck coin will find its way back between the dies and will be struck next to a blank planchet which was fed into the collar. The image of that first struck coin will be impressed into that side of the blank planchet. The result will be a second coin which has images of the first coin impressed into it. Those images will be pressed into the coin and the image will be in reverse. This incuse sunken image is known as a brockage.

## Off-Center Strikes



Off-center coins are one of the most common and best known types of errors. This happens when a blank which is supposed to be fed into the press, lands in the collar improperly. When this occurs only part of the blank is between the upper and lower dies. When the dies strike the blank, only that part will be struck with a design.

## Off-Metals

 ff-metal and wrong planchet errors occur when a correctly made blank from one denomination is accidentally fed into a press for another denomination. Examples are a nickel struck on a cent planchet and a cent struck on a dime planchet. The coin struck on an incorrect blank will weigh exactly what the denomination of that blank would have been. An even more dramatic wrong planchet error is a coin struck on a previously struck coin of a different metal.

## Counterbrockages




#### Abstract

Acounterbrockage error involves a cap die and a previously struck coin. When a cap die strikes a previously struck coin, the obverse design from that struck coin will be impressed into the cap. The result will be a design where the cap face will be an incuse brockage. When a new blank is struck by this cap die with an incuse brockage image, the obverse will have a raised and spread image from that incuse design of the cap. This brockage impression is known as a counterbrockage.

## Fold-Over Strikes



Afold-over coin is one of the most dramatic types of errors. It occurs when the blank is standing vertically between the dies. During the strike, the force is so great that it bends and folds the blank. These fold-overs can be on-center or off-center, and come in many different shapes. There are a few fold-overs with multiple errors, either with an additional strike or fold-over. Denominations above quarters are very scarce.

## Martha Washington Test Pieces



TThere is one set of a Dime, Quarter and Half struck by Martha Washington dies that are permanently housed in the Smithsonian Institute, embedded in blocks of lucite. According to United States Pattern and Related Issues, by Andrew W. Pollock III, "the only trial pieces purported to have survived metallurgical testing in 1965 were the Dime, Quarter Dollar, and Half Dollar equivalent strikes in copper-nickel clad over copper."

Mike Byers' discovery of the Martha Washington Test Piece on a copper-zinc Cent planchet struck $10 \%$ off-center with a uniface reverse was a front page Coin World article on August 7th, 2000.

## MINTEOSNARY



A broadstruck error occurs when a coin is struck without the collar to form the rim and edge that is part of the shape of the coin. Coins can be broadstruck on either type one or type two planchets. When a coin is broadstruck the blank being fed into the collar will spread and distort outward as it is being struck because the collar isn't in the correct position to retain it. Pictured above is a rare date 1897-S Barber Half Dollar broadstruck.
